Rivulus isthmensis sp. n.

D. 9; A. 11; V. 6; P. 15; Ll. 32; Ltr. S.

Elongate, compressed posteriorly, depressed forward. Head broad, much depressed, flattened on the crown, three tenths of the length without the caudal. Snout medium, blum, half as long as the eye. Eye one third of the head, twice the snout, less than the interorbital space. First ray of the dorsal over the middle of the base of the anal, two thirds of the distance from the head to the base of the caudal. First ray of anal midway from head to caudal, last ray nearly as far back as that of the dorsal. Caudal elongate, pointed, as long as the head.

Light olivaceous, with a dark blotch at the base of the dorsal and another on the back above or in front of the first ray of the smal. Apparently there is a light transverse streak at the base of the caudal.
